



The College of Dentistry, founded **I** in 1865, is the third oldest and the largest private dental school in the United States. It offers a predoctoral program leading to the Doctor of Dental Surgery degree, as well as advanced education programs in the dental specialties and allied health programs in dental hygiene. The patient care clinics, laboratories, and other teaching facilities that comprise the College of Dentistry are housed within several buildings, including the Arnold and Marie Schwartz Hall of Dental Sciences and the K.B. Weissman Clinical Science Building. The center is located on the First Avenue, from East 24th Street to East 25th Street, in the midst of one of the nation's most renowned health sciences complexes, which extends from East 14th Street to East 34th Street.

Description and General Requirements:

Continuing Dental Education Programs provide the administrative support for the "Current Concepts in American Dentistry" international advanced education program. Its teaching staff includes NYU College of Dentistry faculty, alumni and outstanding educators for other institutions and from private practice. Program topics and content are determined by the special needs of the group in consultation with the NYU Assistant Dean for Continuing Dental Education, H. Kendall Beacham.

This international advanced education program was established by New York University College of Dentistry in 1981 and now has over 750 graduates from 26 countries throughout the world. In addition to lecture, laboratory sessions and clinical observations, participants are required to complete both a written topic report and clinical cases. To maximize the learning experience, sessions in New York City are limited to a minimum of 20 participants and a maximum of 40. Individual dentists not part of a group may join an existing group on a space available basis. Attendance in New York City is mandatory in fulfilling the requirements for this program. Specific requirements for this international achievement certificate include:

Attendance:


Six (6) weeks attendance of which four (4) weeks of attendance must be at New York

University College of Dentistry in New York City. Up to two (2) sessions of three (3) days each are held in the host city. Participants are encouraged to complete the program in a timely fashion not to exceed

Written Reports:

Participants must complete a written report on a topic to be determined by New York University College of Dentistry. Participants will be given a choice of topics. Written reports must be typed. Recommended report length is 15-25 pages. A list of scientific references should be included. The written report may be in English or another language if the participant is not able to communicate in English. However, if English is not the language selected, a one-page summary in English must be included. Participants are required to bring sufficient copies for distribution to the group. Also, participants will be given an opportunity to summarize their findings. A five (5) to ten (10) minute oral presentation is recommended.

Case Presentations:

During the final week at New York University College of Dentistry, participants are required to document and present two (2) clinical cases.

Program Completion:

Only participants fully completing the requirements are eligible to receive the "Current Concepts in American Dentistry" international achievement certificate awarded by the New York University College of Dentistry, Continuing Dental Education Programs. The final decision for fulfilling these requirements is the responsibility of the Assistant Dean for Continuing Dental Education, H. Kendall Beacham.
